I bid for a pumpkin at one of the church harvest auctions last month. It was huge! Last week my son and I made pumpkin marmalade, and it is delicious, it will make good gifts for Christmas! We had to add oranges and lemons, ginger, sugar, pectin, and all the heat to boil it up ready to put into the jars. We made pots that made us smile! That's a part of life I wonder – you start with one element or ingredient, then spend four times as much and some effort making it into something else! The jars are a wonderful reminder of our colourful season of autumn – hasn't it just set us up for the cold whites of winter? I know many of you had some hard times, and that is life too, ups and downs. With a dash of sweet and spice, attention and warmth, almost anything can be made into a special gift.

At St Edmunds Fenny Bentley last month we held the service of Remembering with hymns and a candle for those we have loved and lost, reminding ourselves that we have committed them into God's hands, and claiming some of the Peace that Jesus offers. It was a popular service and we'll be offering it next year. All welcome, whenever your loved one died, we will offer this space and time for reflection.

Our Remembering in November is much wider, looking outwards to thousands and thousands of service personnel who have given their lives in service for their country, for Peace. This is a special year, 100 years after the Peace that was made at the end of the First World War, the war to end all wars. During our services around 11<sup>th</sup> November we will also give our apologies, say sorry, that all that sacrifice and the sacrifices since have not been able to stop the terrible tragic tendency of humans to wage war, to kill the other human, to be selfish, fight for power, bully for resources, take our religious zeal so far that we want to discriminate, persecute, starve, and even kill other human beings; men, women and children. God forgive us.

When we teach our children to say sorry, we teach them it is not enough to just say sorry, but we have to look the person in the eye, and then try to mend our ways, put the relationship right, and change our behaviour. That's what we should each commit to this year of all years. At the end of the war to end all world wars, we might start at home, making amends with friends, neighbours and family. We should start in our villages and towns, with practical help for

refugees, people facing poverty and kept in depression or unemployment. What about starting in our cities and countryside making sure that modern slavery does not creep into our way of life. With practical action, prayer, campaigning to our local and national government, we could play our part in non-violent fight for the way of life that those young men died for, and young men and women are maimed and die for still.

Is this the cause we can concentrate on before we get to celebrate together the Coming of our Saviour at Christmas? To do each our own small part, being one of the ingredients? To mix and blend each of our efforts to make a new thing; a pot of smiles? To pray together, work together, and have Hope together that we can make a difference? May God give us strength to try.

## **Peak Five – Pondering in the Peak – November 2018**

I'm off to Poland and the city of Krakow in the half term for five days with my family. I have to confess, we don't often get to go abroad, however, this trip has a purpose. My mum has always wanted to visit the area given that we think that our ancestors on my mother's side originally came to the UK from Poland at the turn of the 20<sup>th</sup> Century. We also plan to visit Auschwitz which of course will be an extremely challenging experience, yet, all too important.

As we approach our national day of remembrance how important it is to remember and honour those who have sacrificed themselves to secure and protect our freedom today.

However, I wonder if remembering is more than just recalling the events of history to mind. When Jesus shared his final meal with his disciples he broke bread and said "this is my body given for you; do this in remembrance of me" (Luke 22: 19). To remember is to participate in that final meal. In other words, as Christians we don't just remember history as if it is someone else's story, we identify with what happened so that it becomes part of us, part of our collective memory, and who we are.

In the same way, as the nation comes together to remember the bravery and sacrifice of so many to secure our freedom, we share in their story. And as we take time to reflect on the devastation of war across the Benefice, we do more than remember history which is the story of the past, we also ensure that the memory of those who died lives on in us and perhaps, we might ask ourselves, what then shall I do today?



## Group Community Fire Safety – November 2018

Now we are moving into the cooler weather here are a few facts and tips to keep you safe:

### Heating your home.

#### Central Heating Systems

- Have your Boilers, Fires, Flues and Cookers inspected and tested by a 'Registered Service Engineer'.

#### Open fires.

- Be careful when using open fires to keep warm. Make sure you always use a fire guard to protect against flying sparks from hot embers.
- Make sure embers are under control and properly put out before you go to bed.
- Keep chimneys and flues clean and well maintained.

#### Heating your home (portable heaters).

- Always unplug electric heaters when you go out or go to bed.
- Try to secure heaters against a wall to stop them falling over.
- Only use gas or paraffin heaters in well-ventilated areas.  
Heaters consume oxygen so you could suffocate if a room is not properly aired.

#### Using electric blankets.

- Unplug blankets before you get into bed, unless they have a thermostat control for safe all-night use.
- Store electric blankets flat, rolled up or loosely folded to prevent damaging the internal wiring.
- Have your Electric Blankets tested every 3 years by an approved Contractor /
- Replace your blanket when it is more than 10 years old.

#### If the electricity fails.

Be prepared Keep a torch and batteries handy, where you can find them.

#### Alternative lighting

- If you have to use candles or matches always take special care. Put them out completely before leaving the room or going to bed.

- Use a snuffer or a spoon to put out candles. It's safer than blowing them out when sparks can fly.
- Make sure candles are secured in a proper holder and away from materials that may catch fire – like curtains.
- Keep a mobile phone handy so you can still make an emergency call if there is a power cut.

### Bonfire and Firework Displays

If you cannot attend an organised display and intend to go ahead and hold your own bonfire party, the Derbyshire Fire & Rescue Service asks that you follow the attached safety advice:

- Only responsible adults should deal with fireworks
- Keep fireworks in a closed metal box and take them out one at a time
- Follow the manufacturer's instructions on each firework. Read the instructions by torch light and not a naked flame and always buy fireworks from a reputable source
- Light fireworks at arm's length using a safety firework lighter or fuse wick.
- Stand back after lighting.
- **NEVER** go back to a firework once lit, it may go off in your face
- Keep a bucket of water handy
- Collect used fireworks with care, douse with water and bury them or place in a metal container
- Keep children under control
- Keep pets indoors
- Take care with sparklers – young children should not handle these
- **NEVER** throw fireworks
- **NEVER** keep them in your pocket

If you wish to build your own bonfire please follow this guidance:-

- Site the bonfire well away from houses, garages, sheds, fences, overhead cables, trees and shrubs and well away from your fireworks
- Don't pile your bonfire too high, rather keep adding to it to keep the size reasonable – much less chance of it getting out of control that way.

When lighting the bonfire please follow these safety tips:-

- Before lighting, make sure there are no animals hiding inside
- Be careful when building the bonfire, so it does not collapse once lit
- Don't burn foam filled furniture, aerosols or tins of paint or bottles
- **NEVER** ever use flammable liquids – paraffin or petrol – to light the fire
- Keep everyone, especially children, away from the fire.

In case of an emergency.

- In case of emergency, have a mobile phone available to call the emergency services.
- Keep buckets of water, a garden hose or a fire extinguisher ready.
- When the party is over, pour water on the embers before leaving.

## RECIPE

### **Pumpkin Soup**

**Butter** 25g (1oz)

**Onion** 1, peeled & chopped

**Carrot** 1, peeled & chopped

**Peeled pumpkin** 350g (12oz) roughly chopped

**Salt & pepper**

**Milk** 750ml (1 ¼ pts)

**Natural yoghurt** 150g (5oz)

**Dried pumpkin seeds** to garnish (optional)



1. Melt the butter in a large, lidded saucepan & add the onion & carrot. Cook gently for about 5 minutes until the onions are soft but not brown.
2. Add the pumpkin, milk & seasoning & bring gently to the boil, then reduce the heat, cover & simmer for 30 minutes, until all the vegetables are soft.
3. Transfer soup to a blender & puree until smooth. Return to the saucepan, reheat gently & serve swirled with yoghurt & garnished with pumpkin seeds. Accompany with chunks of warm bread.



### Derbyshire's New Bell Ringers to Honour WW1 Fallen

In our diocese, more than 70 people of all ages have learnt to ring this year ready for Remembrance Sunday, 11 November 2018, for the 100th anniversary of the Armistice. They are some of the 2000 people who have joined the national #RingingRemembers campaign to honour the bell ringers who died in WW1.

The new bell ringers have joined teams of current ringers in churches throughout the Diocese of Derby, giving their local churches and communities that iconic soundscape for Sundays, Christmas, weddings and special occasions. New bell ringers soon become 'hooked' on their new activity, enjoying exhilarating new experiences, effective workouts, challenges and rewards, and a fun social life.

New ringers are still being recruited. If you are interested, please sign up before 11 November 2018.

On the morning of 11 November 2018, muffles will be used to make bells sound alternately loud then soft when they are rung in remembrance of those who gave their lives serving our country.

In the afternoon and evening the muffles will be removed and bells will ring out in celebration of the 100th anniversary of the Armistice: at 12:30pm for 'Ringing Remembers' and at 7:05pm for 'Battle's Over - Ringing Out for Peace'.

A timely reminder to all churches to keep your **A Church Near You** page up to date. Why? Because ACNY will be central to the CofE's #FollowTheStar campaign – coming very soon! First and foremost, please ensure your contact details are up to date, and the times of your regular services.

It's also really important to add details of your Christmas services and events as they are finalised. #FollowTheStar will direct people to your ACNY page throughout the festive period – and the Christmas events you post on there will also be important when A Christmas Near You becomes active in the next few weeks. We will be doing some promotional work on line and on social media from Derby Church House around this too.

Remember that, by default, it is the incumbent who is the editor of a church's ACNY page – and the incumbent can authorise up to five additional editors. If there is no incumbent, or

if the incumbent has changed or the details have been lost, refer to the Editor Help Centre.

#### Need a website for your church?

If your church doesn't have a website, then A Church Near You is a great way of having a site for very little cost! It's a new feature that's been added - all you need is your ACNY page for your church (free) and a domain name (website address), which you will need to buy via a domain name registrar.

### The Dean of Derby, The Very Revd Dr Stephen Hance, writes...



Age 9, I had no great love for music. My mum and dad played records, usually light classical pieces, and my sister liked whatever was on Top of the Pops. But none of this did anything for me. Until one day my mum brought home a copy of The Beatles' Sgt. Pepper. I'd never heard anything like it. I fell in love with that record. The infectious melodies, the intricate arrangements, the way the whole thing flowed and fitted together, even the four faces peering out at me from the gatefold sleeve. I was smitten.

Forty three years later I still love the Beatles, but from that initial smitten-ness came all sorts of other musical loves, from Stravinsky and Taverner to Aretha and Coltrane through to Dylan and U2.

Music, more than any other art form, speaks to me and speaks for me at a deep and profound level. It has soundtracked my life. It has given me language to express things I didn't know how to say. It has put me in touch with the mysteries of the human heart and the mysteries of God more fully than anything else except the Bible.

Throughout history, when Christians have gathered, they have sought to worship and encounter God through music. Be it congregational hymn singing or the performance of a singer or choir, Latin texts sung to a plainsong chant or a brand new song accompanied by guitars and drums, Christians put their praises together in music. I could find something to engage with in almost any type of sung worship but I'm not sure I could survive spiritually in a community where sacred music was not a feature.

We have been thinking about this at Derby Cathedral lately. Canon Richard Andrews has recently begun his ministry with us as Canon for Liturgy, with responsibility for our musical life. We are presently recruiting for a new Director of Music to succeed Hugh Morris, now Director of the RSCM. Also, we have recently opening the new Derby Cathedral School, with its music specialism.

Music sits at the heart of our faith, our worship, and our mission. It is God's gift to express the yearnings of our own heart and to be drawn towards him in beauty and majesty. Speaking for myself, it is one of the gifts for which I am most grateful.







**Planning:** No new planning applications were received in the last two months.

### **Tissington Parish Business**

- 1. Tissington Gates A515 Junction:** Due to local pressure there has been agreement to extend the double white lines from the hill above Tissington Gate down to the cross road and beyond. This should alert drivers that it is an inappropriate place to overtake and increase speed. There is still no news of when this will happen, although it should have been in April. Clerk to request again.
- 2. Church Fete:** Unfortunately due to the weather, the fete was cancelled on the day. The clerk contacted the band to tell them the position. Although the band would accept/appreciate half the fee, the councillors unanimously agreed to pay the full £105, as

the Osmaston Wind Band has been a reliable service in the past, and hopefully for Fetes to come.

3. **Open Gardens:** Cllr Sir Richard reported that this event had gone well, with £750 raised for St Mary's Church.
4. **Grit Bins:** The Parish council has purchased three new green grit bins. This will be installed into the same location as the current grit bins during the autumn.
5. **Water Leak:** Church House – with the summer weather this has dried up. However, this will be monitored going forward.
6. **Annual Parish Day:** Is on the 29<sup>th</sup> September, Cllr Carr would try to attend.

**TMP (Tissington Traffic Management Plan) Update:** No further update.
