





View from the Hill

At the end of my first full year serving the five parishes of the Peak Five benefice (group) I can honestly say the last year has been a privileged, and I am looking forward to what God has for us in 2019. I've been looking down the hill towards the parishes, and reflecting on what a busy, full and interesting year 2018 has been. Many elements that I felt were important as I arrived in September 2017 have become part of our routines.

Our **Morning Prayer in the week at 9am**, is established, as I move around each parish, you can find the dates in the magazine here, and on notices outside each church. I am sometimes joined by parishioners, and sometimes by people on holiday who want to explore how we worship, and the buildings we call home. Regular prayer is such a foundation for our life as Christians, and fellowship in prayer is such a blessing. There's bacon and prayer in the Collies' home in Parwich monthly too! (usually on the first Saturday of the month 8.30am).

The Vicar's Van takes its place every month in each village, often welcoming with a cuppa parishioners or visitors, walkers or holidaymakers, for a cuppa and a chat. It's been an office base for arranging Baptisms (Christenings), giving out old copies of the magazine Christianity, lending books, chatting about birds and wildlife, planning future events, a variety as different as the people I meet. I have missed a couple of times, my apologies.

Giving - Our Benefice Charity has been chosen (I made the decision this year!) and Tools with a Mission will now receive the offerings given at our fifth Sunday Benefice services till the summer. After that, nominations for next year's Benefice Charity will be considered! We need to keep our eyes on the needs of others, both those in our country and far away; our neighbours.

Meeting the community has been such fun; Oddfellows, footballers, film clubbers, school services, horticultural shows, open gardens, Beresfords, Coffee mornings, Fetes, Well Dressings, Charity events, dog walking and just for no reason at all – thank you for smiles and welcome, conversations and laughter.

Sharing Scripture gifts for visitors to our churches have been prepared and displayed in some of the churches, there's more to do next year. We hope that those who call in to view the history will also find peace built on constant prayer, and a safe space to think about life and God's love for us all.

Including Community use of our buildings is beginning to be tentatively explored in three of our churches; Fenny Bentley, Thorpe and Parwich. Very early thoughts of toilets, refreshment facilities and community space supported by advice from Derby Diocese.

Caring - Eco Church – just in November we have begun wondering if the local church can set an example in the community, make ourselves more earth friendly, and contribute to the efforts we make to recycle, our Diocesan advise Stella is sending lots of ideas our way.

Studying - Bible Study and Home Groups are growing, we now have three, in Tissington, Parwich and Thorpe. (see notes in this magazine).

Worshipping; Some **Services in Parwich** have been evolving, and from January we will be one worshipping community, **Methodists and Anglicans** planning and joining together in a new pattern of services. We welcome ideas that are attractive to those who would like to join us to worship, perhaps in different styles.

Sundays, yes! Week on week in the Benefice we worship God, pray through Jesus Christ and receive the Holy Spirit to guide and strengthen us as we cope with all that life has to bring us. We've shared joys and fun, illness and bereavement, helped others, found company and support. Every week there is a service of Holy Communion in at least one of the churches. We've not had to change the service frequency and times as Revd Alan Griggs and Revd Jo Lister have joined us, though we miss Ian and Ilonka Aldersley.

Anticipating! Next year we will be drawing up a **new Electoral Roll** (a list of members of the church). You will be welcome to join, subject to a couple of simple Church rules. We have places on our management committees (Parochial Church Councils), so if any of the above aspects of our church life interest you, or if you have ideas for your Church, please get in touch with me. I expect you could reflect too, and see what God has been doing in your lives? I agree, it has been a busy time, and we all look forward to a break, a change of pace, and time to recharge our batteries! May I wish you a Peaceful Christmas, an interesting New Year, a merry time, safe journeys, and God's blessings.

Peak Five – Pondering in the Peak

As we prepare for the coming of Jesus Christ, this Christmas we will be joining churches across the Church of England in ‘following the star’. The Archbishops of Canterbury and York invite us all to “Come just as you are to take the life-changing Christmas journey” to “...follow the star and to be with Jesus”.

Around 8 years ago I was in rural Wales and took a moment to look up into the dark skies and marvel at the luminosity of the stars. I was already on a journey to explore vocation as a priest and at the time thought of every reason why I shouldn't even entertain the thought. Yet, I can remember this moment when I felt God speak from the vastness of the universe stretched out before me to keep going on the journey to discover more. A universe which likely contains more than 100 billion galaxies and each of those galaxies may have more than 100 billion stars.

Matthew's gospel tells us that astronomers “...saw his star in the East and have come to worship him”. A star speaking to a group we describe as wise men or Magi, dedicated to listening. Christmas is a time when God speaks. I hope in this busy period running up to Christmas, just like the Magi, we can also find a moment to listen. A moment to hear God remind us that even in the vastness of our universe, we are deeply known and truly loved.

Of course, the message and meaning of Christmas isn't just for Christmas! As we turn the page of another year, we can step into 2019 knowing that Christ has come and joins us on life's journey, even when the beauty of the stars are hidden from sight. In other words, just as we know the stars are always there shining brightly, so is the promise of eternal life through Jesus Christ, the Son of God.

I look forward to joining you as we follow the star together to discover the long awaited Messiah, King of the Jews, Son of David, *Immanuel*; God with us, and worship Him.

Electoral Roll.

In 2019 we will be drawing up a new Electoral Roll. Even if you are on the Roll now, you will need to join afresh. Please think if you would like to take that step to belong to your local church. You need to be over 16, Baptised, and then look at the criteria below, and see if you can join us!

Living in the Parish and a member of the Church of England (or a church in communion with the Church of England). Not resident in the Parish but a member of the Church of England (or a church in communion with the

Church of England) and has regularly attended worship in the Parish during the six months prior to enrolment or A member in good standing of a church which subscribes to the doctrine of the Holy Trinity and are prepared to declare themselves a member of the Church of England, having regularly attended worship for 6 months prior to enrolment.

We'll be working on this at the next round of Parochial Church Council meetings (Church management committee). To be an elected member of that committee you need to be on the Electoral Roll. The Rolls will be finalised in the weeks leading up to the Annual Meetings held in April each year. All residents of the parishes are welcome to attend their Annual meeting, and Electoral Roll members can vote. (The Electoral Roll numbers are NOT now used to calculate the Common Fund (the money paid to our Diocese to fund the clergy and Support Teams who help them.) If you would like to ask about this (it seems complicated!) please ring Carolyn on 664132. If you would like to be Baptised (Christened) please ring too!

Group Community Fire Safety – December 2018/January 2019

Hello to you all once again.

How you can be safe from fire this festive season?

Christmas is a special time for celebration and should not end in tragedy because of the extra hazards that are present at this time of year.

Fairy Lights

- Check the fuses are the right type (see the box for the maximum size of fuse you should use).
- If bulbs blow, replace them.
- Don't leave fairy lights on when you go out or when you go to sleep.
- Don't let the bulbs touch anything that can burn easily, like paper.
- Don't overload sockets.
- Always use a circuit breaker (RCD) on outdoor electrical equipment.

Decorations.

- Decorations made of light tissue paper or cardboard burn easily.
- Don't attach them to lights or heaters.
- Don't put them immediately above or around the fireplace.
- Keep them away from candles.

Christmas Trees.

Special fire safety precautions need to be taken when keeping a live tree in the house. A burning tree can rapidly fill a room with fire and deadly gases.

Needles on fresh trees should be green and hard to pull back from the branches, and the needle should not break if the tree has been freshly cut. The trunk should be sticky to the touch. Old trees can be identified by bouncing the tree trunk on the ground. If many needles fall off, the tree has been cut too long, has probably dried out, and is a fire hazard.

Caring for Your Tree.

Do not place your tree close to a heat source, including a fireplace or heat vent. The heat will dry out the tree, causing it to be more easily ignited by heat, flame or sparks. Be careful not to drop or flick cigarette ashes near a tree. Do not put your live tree up too early or leave it up for longer than two weeks. Keep the tree stand filled with water at all times.

Disposing of Your Tree.

Never put tree branches or needles in a fireplace or wood burning stove. When the tree becomes dry, discard it promptly. The best way to dispose of your tree is by taking it to a recycling centre or having it taken away by a community pickup service.

Candle Safety Advice.

The Do's and Don'ts

- Always put candles on a heat resistant surface. Be especially careful with night lights and tea lights, which get hot enough to melt plastic. TVs are not fire-resistant objects.
- Put them in a proper holder. Candles need to be held firmly upright by the holder so they won't fall over. The holder needs to be stable too, so it won't fall over either.
- Position them away from curtains. Don't put candles near curtains or other fabrics – or furniture. And keep them out of draughts.
- Don't put them under shelves. It's easy to forget that there's a lot of heat above a burning candle. If you put it under a shelf or other surface then it can burn the surface.

Make sure there's at least three feet (one metre) between a candle and any surface above it.

- Keep clothes and hair away. If there's any chance you could lean across a candle and forget it's there, put it somewhere else. You don't want to set fire to your clothes or your hair.
- Keep children and pets away. Candles should be out of reach of children and pets.
- Keep candles apart. Leave at least four inches (10cm) between two burning candles.
- Take care with votive or scented candles. These kinds of candles turn to liquid to release their fragrance, so put them in a glass or metal holder.
- Don't move them when they're burning. Extinguish candles before moving them. Also, don't let anything fall into the hot wax like match sticks.
- Don't leave them burning. Extinguish candles before you leave a room. Never go to sleep with a candle still burning. And never leave a burning candle or oil burner in a child's bedroom.
- Use a snuffer or a spoon to put them out. It's safer than blowing them, which can send sparks and hot wax flying.
- Double-check they're out. Candles that have been put out can go on smouldering and start a fire. Make sure they're completely out.

Some of the key Safety Points to consider are:

- ❖ Ensure you have a Fire Emergency Escape Plan for your home.- 'In case of Fire' can we all get out safely through doors or windows.
- ❖ Are all your family and guests aware of the Fire Emergency Escape Plan. – Plan and practice an escape route. If a fire does break out – **Get out, stay out and call 999.**
- ❖ Don't block exits with Christmas trees, presents etc.
- ❖ Be wary of being distracted from cooking due to a houseful of guests.
- ❖ If you've been out for the night, get a take away rather than attempt to cook.
- ❖ If you are using extra heaters ensure they are away from curtains, sofas, Christmas trees and decorations etc.
- ❖ Check on elderly relatives and neighbours as they are at greater risk from fire.
- ❖ 'Check' and 'Test' your 'Smoke Alarms' weekly, include those of your loved ones and elderly neighbours who may not be able to test their own.
- ❖ **'Push the button', working smoke alarms save lives.**

Kitchen Safety.

- ❖ Take extra care in the kitchen – Over 50% of accidental house fires start in the kitchen!
- ❖ Smoke safely – If you have to smoke, it is safer to smoke outside. Ensure you put cigarettes out – **RIGHT OUT!**
- ❖ Make sure you sleep safely – Before you go to bed, carry out a bedtime safety check,
- ❖ Check all doors are closed it could save your life

Car safety.

- ❖ Reduce your speed – Speed is a major factor in fatal road accidents.
- ❖ Leave extra time for car journeys.
- ❖ Drive to the weather conditions – Don't take risks on the roads
- ❖ Do not use a mobile phone when driving!



RECIPES

CHOCOLATE RUM TRUFFLES

100g (4oz) plain flour	50g (2oz) butter
15ml (1tbsp) rum	25g (1oz) ground almonds
25g (1oz) stale cake crumbs	225g (8oz) icing sugar, sifted
drinking chocolate powder	

1. Break up chocolate & put, with butter, into a basin standing over a saucepan of hot water.
2. Leave until both have melted, stirring occasionally.
3. Add rum & mix well.
4. Work in remaining ingredients (except drinking chocolate powder)
5. Transfer mixture into a dish. Chill until firm, about 1 ½ hrs.
6. Roll equal amounts of mixture into 36 balls.
7. Coat in drinking chocolate powder.
8. Transfer into small paper cases.

CINNAMON STARS

2 egg whites	175g (6oz) icing sugar
2 tsp ground cinnamon	250g (9oz) ground almonds
2-3 tsp lemon juice	

1. Whisk the egg whites until stiff, fold in the icing sugar & cinnamon & whisk again until the mixture is of thick dropping consistency. Spoon about 6tbsp of this meringue mixture into a small bowl, cover it & reserve. Continue whisking the rest of the mixture until it forms stiff peaks, then fold in the ground almonds & lemon juice & mix to a thick paste.
2. Form into a ball, wrap in clingfilm & chill in the fridge for about 1hr.
3. Pre-heat the oven to 200C/400F/Gas 6 & butter 2-3 baking trays. Roll the dough out between 2 sheets of baking parchment until it's about 5mm (¼ in) thick.
4. Use a 2.5cm (1in) diameter star cutter to cut out shapes, then place on the baking trays. Re-roll the trimmings until all used up.
5. Bake the stars for 7-8 mins, then remove from the oven. Reduce the temperature to 110C/225F/Gas ¼
6. Using a pastry brush paint the reserved meringue mixture over the biscuits. Return to the oven for about 15mins until the meringue has dried out but not browned. Remove the stars from the oven & transfer to a wire rack to cool. The biscuits will keep for up to 2 weeks if stored in an airtight container.



The Animals' Christmas - Book Review & Competition



Bishop Jan writes...



As I went to brush my teeth the other morning, I was halted in my tracks by a news item on the radio. The Church of England's attendance figures had just been published. It wasn't sounding good. The number of people attending church regularly on a Sunday had declined once again. I picked up the toothpaste with a sigh. And then I paused once again when the reporter went on to say, "But the number of people attending mid-week and occasional services is on the rise." This, they concluded, was "evidence that the Church's desire to relate to cultural change was beginning to bear fruit."

We are so used to going to church on Sunday morning that we sometimes fail to see that those around us are out shopping. Or playing football. Or cleaning the car. Or working in Tesco's. The 'cultural change' the news item referred to is the 24-hour culture we find ourselves in, where Sunday is no longer seen as a special day. Christians will always meet on a Sunday morning. We are, after all, celebrating the resurrection that first Easter Sunday. But for those on the fringes of the church, or for those with no church background at all, any day will do.

Christmas is the time when special services abound. Visitors will come to our

churches for carol services, Christingles, school nativities and Midnight Mass. How will we welcome them? For those of us who preach, how will we connect the old familiar story with the lives of those sitting in front of us? How will we use our noticeboards and websites and parish magazines to invite them in?

The Church of England has produced some excellent materials called Follow the Star. Posters, invitation cards, ideas for families and churches are all included. You can find out more at www.churchofengland.org/christmas But whichever resources you choose, thank you to clergy, lay ministers, churchwardens, sidespeople, organists, choristers, bell ringers, welcomers, tea makers and washer-uppers who will make our churches across Derbyshire places of light and hope and joy this Christmas.

Amidst the busyness may you find time to ponder anew the mystery of our God who, "became flesh and blood, and moved into the neighbourhood." (John 1:14)




